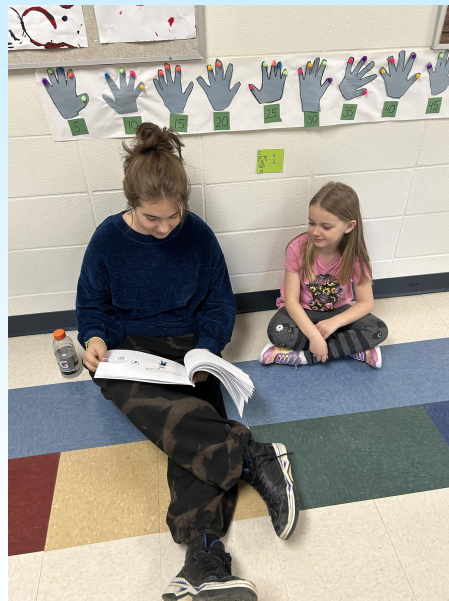
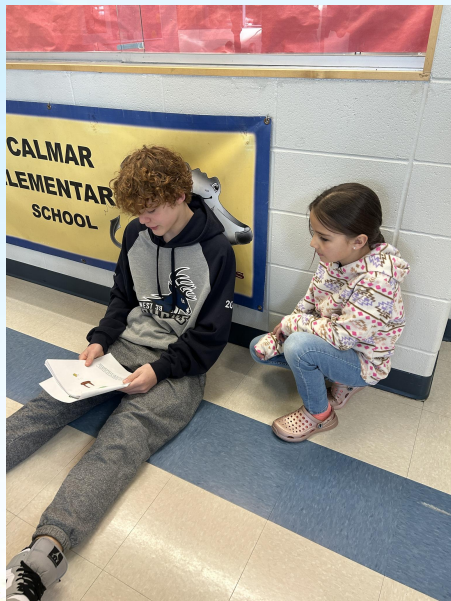

Also, another huge congrats to the West Haven Public School's 5/6 Girls Floor Hockey team on their bronze medal! Great work ladies!



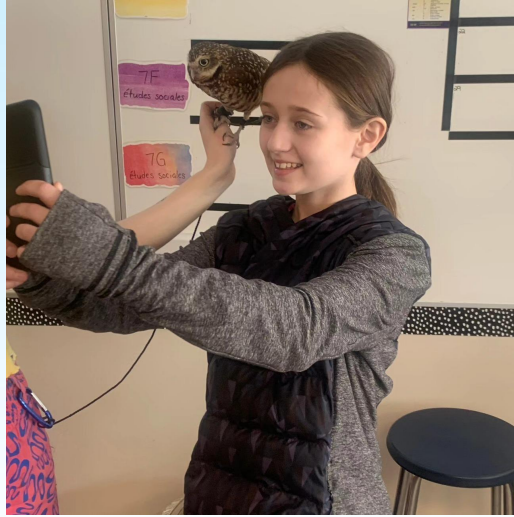

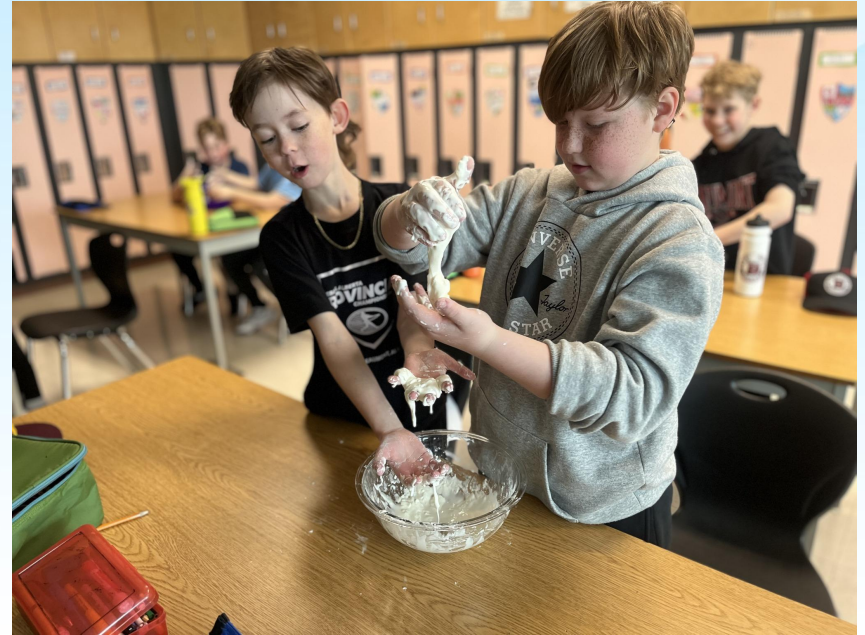

Fifteen teams participated in the BGSD 5/6 Girls Floor Hockey tournament this past weekend at Riverview Middle School. What a great weekend!



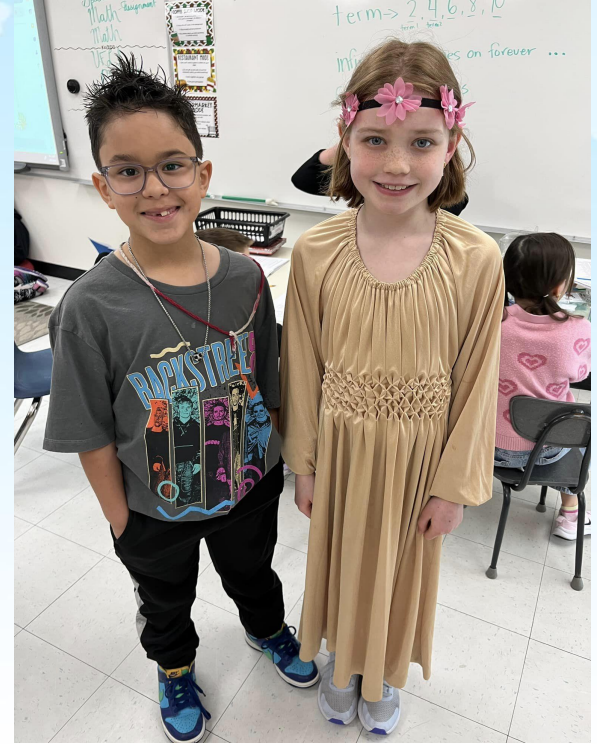
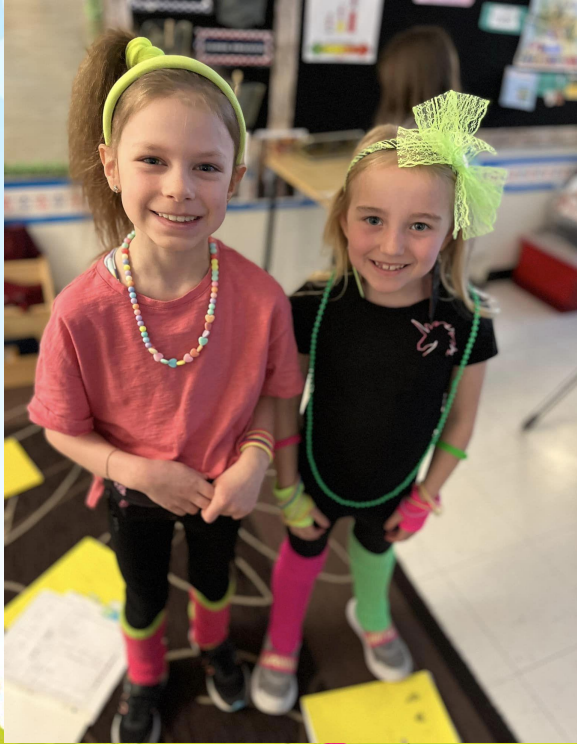
